All campers must complete a swim test and be passed by our lifeguards to play in the water without a lifejacket (which we provide). The test is based off the Canadian Lifesaving Society's Swim to Survive Standard and involves swimming 50 metres and treading water for 2 minutes. Campers are required to wear a lifejacket for all boating activities, even if they have passed the swim test.

## WHAT TO BRING AND WHERE TO GO

We depart from Arch Street in front of Humphrey Hall at 9:00 AM and return at 5:00 PM each day. Before-care is available beginning at 8:00 AM. Alternate pick-up and drop-off locations are available (see "Safety Information" for details).

Please bring:

- A healthy lunch and two snacks, free of peanuts and tree nuts. Please bring your lunch garbage home!
- Water bottle (see footnote) \*
- Wide-brimmed hat (strongly recommended)
- Sunscreen (REQUIRED, minimum SPF 30 strongly recommended please bring your sunscreen to camp, as we will be reapplying it throughout the day)
- Swimsuit and towel
- Close-toed sneakers or hiking boots
- Weather-appropriate clothing (e.g. raincoat, sweater)

\* We recommend sturdy plastic or metal water bottles at least half a litre in size. Glass water bottles and repurposed beverage containers are fragile and not recommended. In keeping with Queen's environmental policies, we strongly discourage plastic bottled water. Drinkable water is available at camp for refills.

- Wear long socks (optional, but recommended due to ticks in the area)
- Insect repellent (optional, but recommended due to ticks in the area)
- Water shoes or sandals (optional)
- Swimming goggles (optional)
- Sunglasses (optional, but recommended)
- Change of clothes (optional)
- Medication if necessary please inform staff in advance, and see the "Medical Information" section of this form for details.

## ECO-ADVENTURE CAMP RULES

- 1. Must follow all counselors' directions at all times.
- 2. No fighting or horseplay (hitting, biting, pushing, shoving or striking another camper or staff).
- 3. No using unacceptable language.
- 4. Must stay with your designated group at all times.
- 5. Must ask permission to leave an area and only with supervision.
- 6. No throwing any objects that should not be thrown.
- 7. Must wear appropriate footwear at all times.
- 8. Must bring and apply sunscreen throughout the day.
- 9. No running outside designated sports areas or when not part of a sanctioned activity.
- 10. Drink water brought from home or obtained from designated water jugs in the Main Lodge.
- 11. Swimming under supervision of lifeguard and only at designated times.
- 12. Swimming will be within the designated area and swimmers must pass an "ability" test before swimming in deeper area outside of the designated buoyed wading area.
- 13. Use of watercraft (canoes and kayaks) can only occur under supervision and when indicated by counselors.
- 14. Life jackets must be worn at all times when in watercraft.
- 15. Canoes will not be taken out by single campers not by campers who have not been taught (or demonstrated) basic skills in watercraft navigation.
- 16. We will employ a buddy system in the swimming area. You must stay with your designated buddy at all times. 17. No littering or refusing to pick up after one's self. (Pack in/pack out)
- 17. Litter from lunches/snacks should be brought home.
- 18. No taking another person's property.
- 19. No vandalism to buildings or other structures on the property.
- 20. No damage should be done to habitats or plants and animals within them.
- 21. When on hikes everyone must stay on the marked paths.
- 22. Bus rules are to be followed while on the bus at all times.
- 23. Respect must be shown to all other campers and counselors. No pranks.
